To announce the competitive entrance examination for the recruitment of 25 (twenty-five) Pupil Magistrates into the Magistracy and Court Registry Division of the National School of Administration and Magistracy (ENAM), for the 2024/2025 academic year.

HEREBY ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

Article 1: 1) A competitive examination for the recruitment of 25 (twenty-five) Pupil Magistrates into the Magistracy and Court Registry Division of ENAM is hereby announced for the 2024/2025 academic year. The examination syllabus is appended to this order.

2) The number of available openings are distributed as follows:

- Judicial Section:
- Administrative Section: 10 (ten).

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Article 2: The examination shall be open to persons who fulfil the following requirements:

- fulfil the general requirements for employment into the public service;
- be a holder of a Masters 1 or "Maîtrise" in private or public Law issued by a Cameroonian university or any other foreign equivalent certificate, recognized by the Minister of Higher Education;
- be at least 17 (seventeen) years of age and 32 (thirty-two) years at most, on 1st January 2024;

 however, persons with disabilities who are holders of a National Disability Card issued by the competent authorities, may benefit from age exemption for a maximum of 5 (five) years above the age limit provided above, in accordance with Order No. 040/PM of 19 May 2022 mentioned above.

Article 3: (1) Registration forms can be dewilloaded on ENAM's website at the following address: www.enam.cm

(2) The registration fee for the constitution shall be 25000 france CFA.

(3) Candidates must pay their registration fees in cash against receipt at BICEC branches.

(4) Candidates can submit their application files against a receipt at ENAM in Yaoundé or at the Regional Delegations of the Ministry of Public Service and Administrative Reform.

(5) Application files shall be submitted at ENAM or at the Regional Delegations of the Ministry of Public Service and Administrative Reform not later than Friday 26 July 2024.

(6)The application files referred to in paragraph (5) above shall include the following documents:

- an envelope bearing a 1500 francs CFA stamp;
- a registration form bearing a 1500 francs CFA fiscal stamp, previously downloaded

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- from the ENAM website (www.enam.cm);
- a certified true copy of the required certificate;
- an attestation of presentation of the original of the required certificate signed by the Governor, the Senior Divisional Officer or the Divisional Officer;
- an attestation of presentation of the original of the GCE A/L or an equivalent certificate allowing the candidate to get access into higher education signed by the Governor, the Senior Divisional Officer or the Divisional Officer;
- a receipt showing proof of payment of registration fees for the competitive examination issued by BICEC;

a certificate of non-conviction of not more than 3 (three) months old signed by the competent judicial authorities;

- a medical certificate 3 (three) months before the date of submission of the file signed by a public sector medical practitioner;
- a certified true copy of the birth certificate handwritten or typed- signed by the competent administrative or council authorities.

N.B.: Any incomplete file or file containing forged or falsified documents shall be rejected.

(7) The list of candidates authorized to sit this competitive examination shall be posted at ENAM latest Wednesday 7 August 2024.

NB: The publication of this list shall serve as individual notification to candidates.
