to announce a competitive examination for the special recruitment of **30 (thirty) Pupil Magistrates of English expression** into the Magistracy and Court Registry Division of the National School of Administration and Magistracy (NSAM) for the 2024/2025 academic year.

- Mindful of decree No. 2011/408 of 9 December 2011 to organize the Government, amended by decree No.2018/190 of 2 March 2018 ;
- Mindful of decree No.2012/537 of 19 November 2012 to organize the Ministry of the Public Service and Administrative Reform;
- Mindful of decree No. 2018/191 of 2 March 2018 to reshuffle the Government ;
- Mindful of decree No.2018/240 of 9 April 2018 to reorganise the National School of Administration and Magistracy (NSAM) ;
- Mindful of decree No. 2000/696/PM of 13 September 2000 to lay down the general system of government competitive examinations;
- Mindful of order No.040/PM of 19 May 2022 to lay down terms and conditions for granting age exemption to persons with disabilities during competitive examinations and recruitment into the Public Service;
- Mindful of order No. 004832/MINFOPRA of 10 October 2012 on the system of studies and schooling in the Magistracy and Court Registry Division of the National School of Administration and Magistracy, VISA

HEREBY ORDERS AS FOLLOWS

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<u>Article 1</u>: (1) A competitive examination for the special recruitment of 30 (thirty) Pupil Magistrates of English expression into the Magistracy and Court Registry Division of the National School of Administration and Magistracy (NSAM), has been announced for the 2024/2025 academic year. The examination syllabus is appended to this order.

- (2) The number of available places is distributed as follows:
 - Judicial Section:
 - Administrative Section: 10;
 - Accounts Section: 10.

Article 2: The examinations shall be open to persons who fulfil the following requirements:

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- a) be a Cameroonian national;
- b) be at least 17 (seventeen) years of age and 32 (thirty-two) years at most as from 1st January 2024;
- c) however, disabled persons holder of a national disability card issued by the competent authorities, may benefit from an age limit waiver for a maximum of 5 (five) years, over the age limit set above, in accordance with the above mentioned order No. 040/PM of 19 May 2022.
- d) have a good mastery of the English anguage;
- e) be a holder of:
 - For the Judicial Section: a Master's 1 of a Matrixe' in English Private Paw issued by a Cameroonian University, or a foreign certificate recognised as equivalent by the competent authority established and approved by the Minister of Justice;

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- For the Administrative Section: a Master's 1 or a "Maîtrise" in Public Law issued by a Cameroonian University, or a foreign certificate recognised as equivalent by the competent authority established and approved by the Minister of Justice;
- For the Audit Section: a Master's 1 or a "Maîtrise" in Economics, Management issued by a Cameroonian University, or a foreign certificate recognised as equivalent by the competent authority established and approved by the Minister of Justice
- f) be physically fit and of good health that will enable the candidate to effectively exercise the duties of a magistrate;
- g) enjoy civic rights;
- h) not having a conviction featuring on the Certificate of non-conviction which leads to disentitlement to hold the office of a magistrate.

<u>Article 3</u>: (1) Application forms can be downloaded from the Ministry of the Public Service and Administrative Reform website (<u>www.minfopra.gov.cm</u>).

(2) The application fees for the competitive examinations stands at FCFA 25,000 (twenty-five thousand) payable to the persons in charge of the counter EXPRESS UNION at the place of submission of the application files.

(3) Candidates can submit their applications, against a receipt, online or directly at Regional Delegations of the Public Service and Administrative Reform.

(4) Applications must arrive at the Regional Delegations of the Public Service and Administrative Reform not later than Friday, 19 July 2024 which is the deadline.

(5) The candidates' application files shall comprise of the following documents:

- a registration form bearing a 1500 CFA francs fiscal stamp. The forms can be obtained at the Ministry of the Public Service and Administrative Reform or at all Regional Delegations of the Public Service or downloaded at the following website address: <u>http://www.minfopra.gov.cm</u>;
- a certified true copy of the required certificate;
- an attestation of presentation of the original certificate signed by the Governor, the Senior Divisional Officer or the Divisional Officer;

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- an attestation of presentation of the original of G.C.E. A/L or any other equivalent diploma allowing the candidate to get access into higher education signed by the Governor of the Region, the Senior Divisional Officer or the Divisional Officer;
- a receipt attesting payment of the registration fee issued by an **EXPRESS UNION** official at the place of submission of the application files;
- a certificate of non-conviction of not more than 3 (three) months old at the date of submission of application, issued by the competent legal authorities;
- a medical certificate of not more than 3 (three) months old at the date of submission of application, issued by a public sector Medical Doctor;
- a certified true copy of birth certificate, handwritten or typed signed by the an administrative or council authority.
- an envelope bearing stamp and the candidate's adress.

<u>N.B:</u> Any incomplete file or a file containing forged or falsified documents shall be rejected.

(6) The list of candidates authorised to sit in for the examinations shall be drawn up and published at the Ministry of the Public Service and Administrative Reform website (<u>www.minfopra.gov.cm</u>) and pasted at the Regional Delegations of the Public Service and Administrative Reform latest **Wednesday 24 July 2024**.

(7) The publication of the lists shall serve as invitation to write the examinations.

<u>Article 4</u>: (1) The tests of the written part of the examinations to take place at the examination centre (Bamenda, Buea, Garoua, Yaounde) chosen by the candidate, shall be done according to the following schedule:

2) The latest time to be allowed in the examination room shall be 7.00 am for the morning papers and 12.30 pm for the afternoon papers.

(3) The examinations shall be written exclusively in the English Language.

Article 5: The oral part of the examination shall consist of:

- an oral presentation of a practical case following an exchange with jury in English Language, on any of the following: Family Law, Criminal Law, Criminal procedure, Civil procedure, Land Law, Law of tort, Business Law, Administrative Law, Constitutionnal Law, Public Freedoms, Human Rights, Administrative Litigation, Public Finances, General Accounting, Economics: coeff. 3;
- an interview with a jury in French language: coeff. 1;

<u>Article 6</u>: Receipts of submission for application for national identity cards of less than three months old at the date of closure of application for the competitive examinations shall not be accepted.

Article 7: Any form of fraud established before, during or after the competitive examination shall be sanctioned in accordance with the regulations in force.
